Māori Achieving Success as Māori

WHĀINGA

- All Māori students are engaged in quality teaching and learning experiences. This may include experiencing success in areas such as academic, sporting, cultural and the arts.
- All stakeholders with a role to play in Māori students' education success: have high expectations for all Māori students, are sharing and growing knowledge and evidence of what works, and are collaborating to achieve excellent educational and Māori language outcomes.
- All Māori students have access to learning pathways of their choice that lead to excellent educational outcomes and the opportunity for Māori language outcomes.
- All Māori students gain 10 credits at level 1 literacy and numeracy.
- All Māori students achieve at least National Certificate of Educational Achievement (NCEA) Level 2 or an equivalent qualification.

ARATOHU

- 1) The Māori Achievement team (including Kaiawhina and Kaitiaki Matua responsible for Māori achievement) will develop and review annually an action plan for Māori achievement within the kura.
- 2) Whānau will be involved in the development of the action plan and have the opportunity to provide further information and support.
